The Disabled American Veterans Open Source Intelligence (DAV-OSINT) Program utilizes homebound disabled veterans to answer today's Open Source Intelligence needs. Each veteran is provided a laptop computer, high-speed internet access, and a skilled management team for support and training. Our team works together in a "Spider web" network across the United States in an effort to collect Open Source information timely and accurately for our customers. The DAV-OSINT network will provide embedded analysis and quality assurance to the collection effort and support time-sensitive Requests for Information (RFI) from government and commercial clientele. This not only enhances current open source collection efforts, but most importantly, it will provide rewarding work for our most deserving Americans, the Disabled Veteran.



The program will be managed at our office located in Front Royal, Virginia (approximately 70 miles west of Washington D.C.) where all customer collection requirements will be processed.

Our vision is to place Collection Managers (CMs) and Disabled Veteran Research Specialists in every state across the nation. As this program develops and the client base expands, we will co-locate analytical and linguistic capabilities near the CMs to provide added-value analysis with each product forwarded to our clients. All deliverables will be maintained within secure but unclassified repositories in Front

Royal, Virginia. Using advanced proprietary software, we will integrate technology that will exploit subdued associations and relationships, while presenting the products visually with a web-based link analysis program.

To date, there are over 22,000 disabled veterans from Operations Enduring and Iraqi Freedom alone. By using America's heroes, the DAV-OSINT Program will change the face of open source intelligence collection through net-centric capabilities and focal reach-back support for rapid response to our customer's research requirements.
